If you are bullied:

DO:

- ✓ Ask them to STOP if you can
- ✓ Use eye contact and tell them to go away
- ✓ Ignore them
- ✓ Walk away and find different friends to play with
- ✓ Find an adult to tell or talk to
- ✓ TELL SOMEONE

TRY NOT TO:

- Believe what they say
- **x** Retaliate
- Think it's your fault
- × Hide it

What if I see someone else is being bullied?

- Don't just walk away and ignore the bullying, find an adult.
- Ask the child if they need help.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.
- Tell the bully to stop if it is safe to do so.
