Bramble class

Term 3 has been a very quick but productive term in Bramble Class. The children have made so much progress in their confidence and are becoming very independent learners. Our theme this term has been 'Ticket to Ride' and we have been thinking about transport and journeys.



On a very cold and icy morning, we went for a walk to the duck pond to feed the ducks. When we got there, the pond was frozen and we enjoyed watching the ducks skate towards us.

As part of our Understanding the World, Mr Stevens came to talk to us about Scotland and showed the class his kilt. We then learnt about Burns Night and everyone tried some haggis!





Now the children are very confident at sounding out words in order to write, we have been focusing on writing captions and short sentences. We have been writing captions for our word of the week.

We ended the term by learning about the Lunar New Year. We read the story of the Great Race, learnt how it can be celebrated and tried to use chopsticks to eat our snack!







TERM 3



In this term our topic was the history of transport! We learnt all about the many different forms of early transport and made lots of artwork about it this term. We made huge drawings of Viking boats in teams, as well as using our design and technology skills to make our own moving cars!

We particularly loved science this term where we looked at animals. We have even been on locals walks to look at the ducks and horses to help us classify mammals and birds!

TERM 3 - OUR LEARNING

We have been very busy in term 3! Our topic has been 'Ticket to Ride' and we have looked at the history of different modes of transport. We've learnt all about key figures like George Stephenson, The Wright Brothers and Ford. In English, we have investigated a gorgeous story called 'Rabbit and Bear'. We would recommend this story to anyone! We have written letters and non-chronological reports. Multiplication has been our main focus in maths, with the children learning all about the relationship between multiplication and division.





In art, the children have explored watercolour and have create their own abstract paintings, using line and shape. We've investigated habitats in science, looking at places in our local area and beyond and learnt all about pitch and tempo in music. In PE, we have been making our own dances and looking at sending and receiving games. In RE, we've looked at 'What is the good news Jesus brings?' and delved into prayer. A successful term 3 for Honeysuckle!

Foxglove Class

This term, the children in Foxglove Class have been exploring and discussing the book, 'The King Who Banned the Dark." They have discussed political dilemmas, looking at the morality of decisions made by authority figures within the book. The King in the story decides to ban the dark in the town he rules over. The children split into news teams, conducting interviews and taking phots at the scene. They then wrote their own newspaper articles reporting on this..

The children have also enjoyed learning about light and dark. They have looked at opaque, transparent and translucent objects and have conducted experiments looking at shadow size. They also looked at how to write a scientific report.



Foxglove have just finished learning about multiplication and division in maths and have moved on to length. They have also had a brilliant time learning and creating a routine in gymnastics using quality and control.

CLOVER CLASS



In English, we have been reading Varjak Paw by S.F. Said. Across the term, we have been doing lots of drama work, focusing on the characterisation of different characters whilst building confidence in reading and presenting their work to the class. We have been building up a tension toolkit, using different features to draw in the reader including the rule of three, short sentences and powerful verbs.

In maths this term our focus has been on **multiplication and division**. The children have really got to grips with using place value grids and counters to support them with multiplying and dividing 2-digit and 3-digit numbers. This has helped them to move on to using formal written methods.





On Thursday 11th January Clover class travelled by train, to Maidstone, to visit the Museum. Whilst there we took part in two workshops to deepen our learning on Ancient Egypt. In the first workshop we ordered the steps of the mummification process. Then we got to handle artefacts and we had to make a decision about whether they were actually 5000 - 2000 years old or if they were replicas. The second workshop was very messy! We had to follow the mummification process to mummify oranges! This was lots of fun. Finally we visited the Ancient Egyptian exhibition and saw Ta-Kush, their resident Ancient Egyptian mummy.

The topic for this term in Science was **electricity**. We have learnt how to create a simple circuit, how to draw circuits using the correct symbols, investigated conductors and insulators and finished the term creating our very own circuit powered torches out of water bottles!









It has only been a fairly short term, but we have covered a lot: comparing Mayan and Anglo-Saxon culture and politics, learning about magnetism and building electrical circuits, fractions, division and multiplication, to name but a few.

We have been building up our awareness of grammar through lyric videos and in music we dipped our toe into the Baroque and Romantic periods.

The children have really enjoyed their gymnastics with Mr Pain and have developed their hockey skills well.

The highlights of the term have been twofold: it has been fantastic to see the children acting out the qualms and machinations of the Thane of Glamis and Lady Macbeth from the Scottish Play; but the real highpoint was clearly our trip to the O2 to perform with nine thousand other children in a spectacular sound and light show – it was a truly uplifting experience and the children did themselves proud.
